COVENANT CORNER

This is a tier one violation, \$25 fine.

~ Front porches are not to be used for storage. Patio/deck furniture is allowed in season however ladders, canoes, firewood, old appliances, etc. are not to be stored on porches. This is a tier one Violation, \$25 fine.
