DITCHES

We wanted to send you a quick reminder about making any alterations to your home. If you are at the point where your house needs a makeover, please do not forget to contact Demerie at Grand Teton Property Management first. Whether you are going to repaint or stain your house a different color, add a deck or fence, build an addition, or make some other change to the exterior of your home, the Melody Ranch Design Review Committee must first approve your plans. By submitting your ideas and designs in advance, it will avoid potential problems or complications. If you are simply restaining your house or fence the same color, or doing work on the interior of your home, this is not something you need to submit. MINING PERMIT

By now you have all received the Final Public Notice for the mining permit that was applied for by our neighbor, RST Sand and Gravel. The board of directors is working to understand the legal details of the mining permit while Tina Korpi has spoken directly with Roger Seherr-Thoss about how the mining permit will potentially impact homeowners in Melody. While the board is considering submitting a letter to the DEQ on behalf of the HOA, we would also encourage all homeowners to submit their thoughts and comments to: Administrator of the Land Quality Division of the DEQ, Herschler Building, 122 West 25th Street, Cheyenne, WY, 82002 no later than the close of business on May 20th, 2016.

SEWER REMINDERS

Sewer overflows and backups can cause health hazards, damage to your home, and threaten the environment. With this in mind, there are several easy ways to prevent this from occurring at your home. Many times grease is washed into the plumbing system, usually through the kitchen sink. This can create problems as it sticks to the insides of sewer pipes and over time can block the entire pipe. The results can be both expensive and inconvenient: raw sewage can overflow into your home or that of your neighbor, a park or even the street. The potential contact you may have with disease-causing organisms and the operation and maintenance costs for clean up can be daunting. Be sure to ask your family or any other person in your home to please refrain from flushing cleaning rags and cloths in the toilet. Even the disposable "flushable" cleaning cloths can cause trouble. Additional items that you do not want in your sewer system include fats, oils, grease, cooking oil, flammable liquids, egg shells, coffee grounds, disposable diapers and feminine hygiene products, floss, cat litter, toys, medications, and paint. COVENANT CORNER

~ Maintenance of the exterior of the dwelling by the owner shall include, but not be limited to, periodic staining/painting of wood siding and fences, and the landscaping maintenance of yards including weed control, watering and mowing as needed. The HOA can maintain said property in the event that the homeowner does not comply. This is a Tier Three Violation, \$250 fine.

~ Clotheslines. Outside clotheslines or other outside drying or airing facilities shall be maintained exclusively within a fenced service yard and shall not be visible from neighboring properties. This is a Tier One Violation, \$25 fine.
