LIGHT POLLUTION

The board has received some recent requests concerning exterior lighting within Melody Ranch. A while ago, we ran an article about light pollution in an attempt to enlighten you about the topic. Light pollution, as you may know, is the brightening of the night sky with artificial lights. Melody Ranch adheres to the Teton County guidelines when it comes to exterior lighting options. We would like to remind you that all exterior lights must be down-facing. In addition, the bulb should be covered by a shade of some type that completely hides the light bulb from view (unless you are standing directly below it). We would also like to remind you to turn your exterior lights off when not in use, or consider using timers or motion sensors to cut back on any excessive lighting of your lot. TREE FORTS

We have been notified recently of children making forts on the open space and in vacant lots. While the HOA supports this imaginative and fun play, please do not permit your children to cut any branches from any trees to build their forts. Several tree branches were cut from open space trees causing some grief for neighboring residents. As the weather warms up and we enter summer vacation, please remind your children to be respectful of the neighborhood — and its trees.

FAT-FREE SEWERS

Fats, oils, and greases are not just bad for your arteries and your waistline; they are bad for sewers, too.

What we can do to help: The easiest way to solve the grease problem and help prevent overflows of raw sewage is to keep this material out of the sewer system in the first place.

- 1. Never pour grease down sink drains or into toilets
- 2. Scrape grease and food scraps from plates, pots, pans, utensils, and grills and cooking surfaces into a can or the trash for disposal.
- 3. Do not put grease down garbage disposals. Put baskets/strainers in sink drains to catch food scraps and other solids, and empty the drain baskets/strainers into the trash for disposal.

COVENANT CORNER

- ~ All household and maintenance items such as wheel barrows, ladders, lawn mowers, snow blowers, bins, etc should not be left in open view and should be stored within a closed area such as a garage and/or behind fenced enclosure or "out of sight" from the road and neighboring properties view . This is Tier One Violation, \$25 fine.
- ~ Trees and Landscaping. No trees or bush growing on any Lot shall be felled or trimmed nor shall any natural areas be cleared, graded or formal lawn areas constructed, or landscaping performed on any Lot without the prior written permission of the DRC. This is a Tier One Violation, \$25 fine.
