WEED SPRAYING

If you own If you own a vacant lot and would like to be responsible for spraying your noxious weeds this year, please notify Demerie at Grand Teton Property Management. If you opt to have the HOA do your spraying, the cost will be \$50 per application and it is done twice over the summer. If we do not hear from you by March 31st, we will assume you want us to spray and you will see the charges on your monthly statement.

DOG REMINDERS

Neighbors, there have been numerous reports of dogs running loose in the neighborhood. PLEASE be sure to keep your dogs on a leash to avoid other people or animals being attacked and injured. We would ask owners to contact animal control in the event of an incident or loose dog as they are trained and skilled in these matters. 307-733-2331

SHOVELING REMINDERS

Neighbors, please remember that it is against state law to shovel the snow from your driveway into the roadway. As it creates a hazard for cars and pedestrians, please remember to push or blow your snow into your yard or onto your banks and **refrain from shoveling into the street or in the open space**. Thank you for your cooperation!

SKI TRACK

If you take your pet on the ski track, please remember to grab a mutt mitt to clean up after your beloved friend. Also, please be sure that your dog is either on a leash or is disciplined enough to be voice controlled by you. With the number of neighbors skiing and the wildlife that loves to spend time in Melody Ranch, we want to be sure the ski track is a positive environment for all. Please be sure to help preserve the conditions of the ski track. If you are on foot, please stay on the walking paths rather than the groomed ski track. Thank you for your efforts in keeping this amenity a fun and safe experience for all the residents in Melody Ranch.

LANDSCAPING ISD ROAD LOTS

In recent months, the ISD has received questions regarding the planting and maintenance of trees and landscaping that are located within the "Road Lots" throughout Melody Ranch. The Road Lots encompass the physical roads throughout Melody Ranch and extend approximately 15 to 20 feet beyond the road surface on either side. The edge of the Road Lot is also where the water supply connection (curb stop) is located for each Lot. The Road Lots extend beyond the road surface primarily to allow for snow storage.

Historically, property owners have been granted permission by the Melody Ranch Homeowners' Association (the "HOA") to landscape and plant trees and/or shrubs within the Road Lot and the Melody Ranch ISD (the "ISD") has agreed to this permissive use. The HOA and ISD do not see a need to change this policy. However, it is important to understand that each property owner bears the responsibility for the maintenance and upkeep of the landscaping and trees in the Road Lot, whether planted by you or by a previous owner of your property. If a tree falls within the Road Lot, it is the owner's obligation to schedule and pay for removal (as was the case for many owners in the windstorm last September). Likewise, in the event trees or landscaping were ever to interfere with the ISD's use of the road lot, the ISD could require removal of such trees and landscaping. This has not been a major issue in the past, though on occasion the ISD does require vegetation to be cut back to allow for better visibility for drivers, bikers, and pedestrians. In the event an owner is unable or unwilling to take the steps necessary to address the above, the ISD may take the required action and bill the Owner. Finally, if there is unintentional damage to trees or landscaping as a result of snow plowing, the ISD is not responsible for such damage.

This is a Tier One, \$25 fine.
