Getting Ready for Winter

With Snowplowing season upon us, we would like to remind you to be courteous and patient with the snowplow drivers. They work to make our roads passable during the winter months.

Rules and Reg's Reminder

Holiday Décor: Holiday decorations including Christmas lights, wreaths and garland should be removed in a timely manner after the holiday has passed. Christmas lights shall be allowed from Thanksgiving Day until February 15th.

Christmas Tree Pick Up

Melody Ranch will once again be offering Christmas tree pick up on Tuesdays and Thursdays following Christmas. If you would like to dispose of your tree, please leave it at the curb on December 28, 30, January 4, 6, 11, or 13. Please note, that after January 13th, this service will no longer be available, and you will be responsible for disposing of your own tree. Be sure to have all of your lights, ornaments and tinsel completely removed from your tree prior to disposal. Kindly, do not put your tree outside if it is snowing heavily. This can cause the tree removal to be difficult if it is buried in the snow. Thank you!

Shoveling Reminders

Neighbors, please remember that it is against state law to shovel the snow from your driveway into the roadway. It creates a hazard for cars and pedestrians when extra snow is moved into the road. Please remember to push or blow your snow into your yard or onto your banks and refrain from shoveling into the street or in the open space. Thank you for your cooperation!

Slow Down

We know that it is the season to hustle and bustle, but please remember that the speed limit in Melody Ranch is 15 mph. With snow and ice-packed roads, more people working and going to school at home, more dog-walking on the roadway, and local moose and other wildlife hunkering down in the neighborhood, we would ask everyone to please slow down. Take a minute, be observant, drive within the limit, and keep everyone safe this winter. Thank you!!

Covenant Corner

- ~ Front porches are not to be used for storage. Patio/deck furniture is allowed in season however ladders, canoes, firewood, old appliances, etc. are not to be stored on porches. This is a tier one Violation, \$25 fine.
- ~ Wildlife Protection. It is recognized by the Association and the purchasers or Owner of any Lot within the Property, that many wildlife species live on or migrate through the Property during various times of the year. Please respect seasonal limitations on use and do not harass the wildlife. This is a Tier Two, \$100 fine.

RV Storage

Just a quick reminder to those of you with a storage space in the Melody RV lot that there are quite a few homeowners who are still on the waiting list for a spot. If you do not need your space anymore, please notify GTPM so we can pass it to the next family. Also, please keep in mind that the storage area is intended for recreational vehicles and trailers; it is not to be used to store trash, construction equipment, yard gear etc. Please see the storage rules and regulations for a more comprehensive list.
