Old Business:

- 1. Matt Ostdiek- ACTION ITEMS
 - a. 25 curbstops- Actions and addresses
 - i. No progress to report
 - b. Valve project irrigation/ road paving/ lawn repair work.
 - i. Road patches completed
 - ii. Raise valve risers to street surface
 - 1. Tentatively scheduled for end of next week, August 5, 2022...
 - iii. Landscape repairs
 - Lawngevity to squeeze into schedule when they have a load of sod delivered- only about one day of work
 - c. Sewer System Cleaning and TV Inspection
 - i. Work completed, added \$300 charges to vacuum of sewer lift station.
 - 1. Val Kotter Invoice \$42,022.20
 - 2. Everything looks to be in pretty good shape
 - ii. Sewer Service with excessive flow discovered (Water/Sewer Rules 3.9)
 - 1. Enforcement action/fine. Town of Jackson wants to be involved.
 - a. New construction- 1329 Melody Creek Ln.- Matt will take care of communication with homeowner.
 - b. Debbie to send out annual letter to lift station homeowners.
 - d. Exploratory Test Well

- i. Draft geological report submitted to WWDO.
- ii. Waiting final invoice from Dover Drilling.
 - 1. Have not heard back from Dover Drilling. Matt Ostdiek reached back out to them.
 - Matt Ostdiek to add reclamation to his list.
 - a. Bob Hammond- Lets to it after October 1, 2022 that way we won't need to irrigate.
- ii. Close out WWDO Groundwater Exploratory Grant Project
- e. Water system Improvement Project
 - i. Project Cost estimate Melody Ranch Drive Deep Well
 - 1. Estimated total projects cost: \$250,000
 - 2. Original total project cost (Existing Funding): \$144,000
 - 3. Funding shortage: \$1,056,000
 - 4. Maximum addition WWDO Grand Funding (67%): \$707,520
- f. 7/25/22 WWDO Discussion Bill Brewer/ Jeff Kaiser
 - 1. They are moving towards us going with a smaller well to just barely meet our minimum flow with one well out of service. This would be at Test well #2 site.
 - 2. They are more focused on our peak day demand and not our hour demand.
 - a. DEQ only requires us to meet our average day demand which is only at a little over 200 gallons a minute. That will not work to get us through the summer months.
 - b. Our max day demand is approx. at 700 gallons per minute. He suggested to maybe only shoot for a 100 to 150 gallon a day well. Bottom line they are required to cut funding so this is their way to do so.
 - 3. Bob Hammond- He was under the impression they were ok with drilling the well at the site near Melody Ranch Dr. They would fund a shallow well and they were willing to pay for the shallow well even if we go deeper. They were also ok with funding the upgrades to the lines up to the pump house.
 - a. Matt Ostdiek agrees
 - b. They are encouraging us to get the ARPA funding for this project. Matt Ostdiek thinks it will be hard to get as there will be a lot of competition for funding. ARPA applications are due on August 12, 2022.
 - i. Rich B.- We need to apply for this funding.
 - 4. A zoom meeting to put together a Resolution for Grant Funding application is set for Monday, August 8, 2022 at 2pm
 - a. Jim Hammerel moves for a do not to accede \$5000 for Matt Ostdiek to put together application for ARPA. Kent Van Riper 2nd. Motion passed unanimously
 - 5. WWDO supports funding well pump enlargements
 - 6. WWDO will not pay for upgrades supporting excessive irrigation demand and fire protection.
 - 7. Cost saving for smaller well and maybe smaller transmission lines.
 - 8. WWDO request due September 1, 2022
