CHRISTMAS TREE PICK UP

Melody Ranch will once again be offering Christmas tree pick up on Tuesdays and Thursdays following Christmas. If you would like to dispose of your tree, please leave it at the curb on January 2, 4, 9, 11, or 16. Please note, that after January 16th, this service will no longer be available, and you will be responsible for disposing of your own tree. Be sure to have all your lights, ornaments and tinsel completely removed from your tree prior to disposal. Thank you!



SLOW DOWN

Homeowners, please remember the speed of the roadways in Melody Ranch is 15 mph. This is especially important with the snow and icy conditions we receive through the winter. Not all intersections and roads are sanded, so please use extra caution and slow down to avoid collisions with each other, pedestrians, animals, signs, etc. We ask that you adhere to the posted speed limit and request the same of your guests. Together we can keep our neighborhood a safe place for everyone.

DOG REMINDERS

Neighbors, there have been numerous reports of dogs running loose in the neighborhood. PLEASE be sure to keep your dogs on a leash to avoid other people or animals being attacked and injured. SHOVELING REMINDERS

Neighbors, please remember that it is against state law to shovel the snow from your driveway into the roadway. As it creates a hazard for cars and pedestrians, please remember to push or blow your snow into your yard or onto your banks and **refrain from shoveling into the street or in the open space**. Thank you for your cooperation!

GETTING READY FOR WINTER

Homeowners may place stakes one foot off of the pavement line to help plow drivers. This will prevent yard damage and give plow truck drivers enough room to allow full use of the roadways in clearing snow. The stakes must be clearly placed and may need to be replaced as the season progresses. The snowplow service will not take responsibility in replacing broken or plowed-in stakes as this is the homeowner's responsibility.

COVENANT CORNER

~ Trash receptacles are to be placed at the edge of
driveways only on the designated trash day. Once
trash has been picked up, these receptacles must be
removed from driveways within 24 hours. When not
on the street for trash pick-up, all trash receptacles
are to be stored in the garage or "out of sight" behind
a fence enclosure. All trash must be kept in bins at all
times. Bags of trash or other household items being
disposed of are never to be left outside bins.
This is a Tier One, \$25 fine

~Wildlife Protection. It is recognized by the
Association and the purchasers or Owner of any Lot
within the Property, that many wildlife species live on
or migrate through the Property during various times
of the year. Please respect seasonal limitations on
use and do not harass the wildlife.
This is a Tier Two, \$100 fine.
