# Rules and Reg's Reminder

Holiday Décor: Holiday decorations including Christmas lights, wreaths and garland should be removed in a timely manner after the holiday has passed. According to Melody Ranch CCRs, Christmas lights shall be allowed from Thanksgiving Day until February 15th. But please abide by any Teton County Regulations.

# Getting Ready for Winter

With Snowplowing season upon us, we would like to remind you to be courteous and patient with the snowplow drivers. They work to make our roads passable during the winter months.

#### Exterior Fire Reminder

There shall be **no exterior fires** whatsoever except barbecue fires contained within designated receptacles, i.e.: grills. This is a Tier Four Violation, \$300 fine plus applicable legal fees.

### Watch for E-Bikes

There have been a few close calls within Melody Ranch between e-bikers and vehicles. Please remember that e-bikers should follow the rules of the road while occupying the road. Please stop for stop signs and be cautious around people walking in the neighborhood. Together we can keep Melody Ranch a safe place to live.

## Be Bear Aware

As the leaves on the trees change and fall descends upon the valley, we would like to remind everyone of the importance of being aware of bear conflicts, especially in light of the recent bear sightings throughout the town and county neighborhoods. Please remember that we live in bear country and need to stay bear aware.

Please remember not to put your garbage out the night before pickup and to store garbage and bird feeders properly as per Teton County regulations. The Teton County Land Development Regulation is requiring that garbage is to be stored in certified bear resistant containers or in a secure building or enclosure. Teton County Regulations require bear-resistant trash containers even on trash day and are fining \$750 a day for non-compliance.

All bird feeders are to be hung with a catch pan, at least 10 feet from the ground, deck railing or patio and 4 feet away from any tree, post, or support structure.

Allowing bears to get a food reward conditions them to associate food with people, which may lead to dangerous or destructive behaviors.

#### Covenant Corner

- ~ All household and maintenance items such as wheel barrows, ladders, lawn mowers, snow blowers, bins etc. should not be left in open view and should be stored within a closed area such as a garage and/or behind fenced enclosure or "out of sight" from the road and neighboring property's view. This is Tier One Violation, \$25 fine
- ~ Dogs are to be restrained or leashed within the community at all times. First Violation: If any animals are caught or identified chasing or otherwise harassing livestock, wildlife, people, vehicles or bicycles, the Board shall have the authority to have such animal or animals impounded, and shall assess a penalty against the owner of such animal or animals of \$250.00 plus all costs of impoundment.

## **RV** Storage

Just a quick reminder to those of you with a storage space in the Melody RV lot that there are quite a few homeowners who are still on the waiting list for a spot. If you do not need your space anymore, please notify GTPM so we can pass it to the next family. Also, please keep in mind that the storage area is intended for recreational vehicles and trailers; it is not to be used to store trash, construction equipment, yard gear etc. Please see the storage rules and regulations for a more comprehensive list.
